ENTRY: This comic strip competition is open only to Angus Council Primary Schools pupils attending P5 to P7. A power point presentation from MVV will be provided to schools on Health and Safety symbols and Health and Safety as part of their LOCHER project. Using this [presentation](#) and the provided entry form children should be encouraged to take up the challenge to create their own comic strip on safety. The comic strip can be based on safety, health or health and safety. The key focus is that children use their imagination. There are additional comic strip resources to share with pupils as examples. Entries will be judged on the merits of skills used in relation to: focussing, creativity, curiosity & communication.

Each school should collate their entries together by the 28 May 2021 and should choose their top 3 entries for their school based on the criteria. Each school may choose who undertakes the judging for their school to find their own top 3 entries. The top 3 entries from each school should then be photographed and with their entry formed emailed to AngusWorks@angus.gov.uk by week ending 4th June 2021. All entries will be then be judged by a panel and reduced to 3 top entries, which will then be judged by DC Thomson's for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

Judging will take place week 7 June 2021 and winners announced week 14 June 2021. Winners will be announced week 14 June 2021 on DYWD&A social media platforms and by email to the schools.
